A slang term for an attractive young woman.

Babe meaning 'a pretty girl' is recorded (especially in US English as a term of address) from 1915, but has been repopularized in the nineties, especially through the 'Wayne's World' sketches and films (see NOT), with an extra emphasis on the element of sexual desirability. (In the film Barb Wire, the heroine, played by Pamela Lee Anderson, habitually demands, 'Don't call me babe!') Some uses of babe applied to an attractive man are recorded, but in the main a babe is assumed to be female, and may be described by the adjective babelicious.

He has gray hair, is on the short side and is not what I would refer to as a babe.
